Results of the Pandemic on a Nurse's Mental Health

In a 2020 survey of 629 nurses, results revealed high rates of depression (22 percent), anxiety (52 percent), and insomnia (55 percent) among nurses. Difficulty sleeping was both a contributing factor to and an outcome of poor mental health. To decrease stress-related sleep problems, ensure time away from work, avoid excessive overtime hours and shifts that quickly switch between day and night. Employers can consider flexible working arrangements and shifts to help maintain healthy balance of their staff.

February is International Prenatal Infection Prevention Month. Prenatal infections include bacterial or viral illnesses that can be passed from a mother to her baby during pregnancy or during the delivery process.

March is Endometriosis Awareness Month.

Sudden Unexpected Postnatal Collapse (SUPC) of the Newborn

Did you know that SUPC is a rare but serious event, and typically occurs in term or near-term newborns within the first week of life? Significant risk factors for the newborn include skin-to-skin care/breastfeeding, positioned prone/side lying in crib, and co-bedding with parents. Inadequate parent education, support, and supervision places infants at increased risk for poor outcomes and SUPC. The Loyola APC has collaborated with its network hospitals on a QI project addressing SUPC. We will share a standardized education program with all hospitals in late Feb/early March.
