Academic Research Curriculum

- 3-year longitudinal curriculum for <u>all</u> residents.
- Activities include writing workshops and detailed reviews of scientific articles focusing on research methods, study design, biostatistics, interpretation of data, and critical analysis.
- Led by dedicated faculty members and divided into small groups for focused content.

Research Elective

- Two tiers of dedicated research time:
 - Research Associate: maximum of 3 weeks per senior year of residency.
 - Research Scholar: maximum of 6 weeks per senior year of residency, with poster presentation at a local/national conference.
- Poster presentation at Loyola Resident Research
 & Quality Improvement Day.
